

Give it a Go & Recruitment Stalls

A key goal on the Union's plan is Make Getting Involved Easier. This means showing our members that it is easy to get involved in activities throughout the academic year. In order to meet this goal we would like groups to run more Give it a Go sessions and to have recruitment stalls in the Union building advertising what their group does and when it does it.

To make it more attractive for groups, we have set aside funding that you can access if you run a Give it a Go session or have a stall in the building.

Funding List

Below is a set list explaining how much funding you could receive for running each type of recreational or recruitment event.

Type	Sports Clubs, Outdoor Activities, Martial Arts & Dance	Volunteering, General Interest, Media, Performing, Political & Campaigning, Cultural & Religious, Departmental
Give it a Go session	£150	£75
(Bonus if you get 15 people who aren't already members of your group to attend)	£200	£75
Recruitment Stall	£50	£50

Note: There is a difference in the amount of funding available for different types of groups. This is because there is an emphasis on running recreational sessions in sport or physical activities. This is as a direct result of what members have asked for us to provide.

Conditions:

- You can only receive funding for these things if they are run from 23rd October onwards.
- You will only receive funding if it has been agreed before you run either the event or the stall.
- All funding will be received after the event or stall has taken place.
- You can only receive funding for one of each type, each term.
- Funding will be put into your grants accounts and will be subject to the conditions of those accounts.

Give it a Go conditions:

In order to receive funding for a Give it a Go session, you must do something out of the ordinary for your group. You cannot simply open one of your sessions. The event you run must be specifically aimed at bringing in new members or people who don't currently take part.
